Horndean Infant Schools vision is that learning is for everyone – anytime, anywhere. The school has worked closely as a team to engage children, families and the wider school community through their development of the UniServity cLc (connected Learning communities) Learning Platform.

The whole school community have been involved through everyday classroom activities such as AfL based question forums and quizzes, through to parental reading blogs, learner's achievements being celebrated and attainment evidence through ePortfolios, connecting classrooms internationally as far afield as Africa, and staff development based monitoring and CPD sharing. Led by outstanding Headteacher Becky Greenhalgh, the school has used their learning platform to achieve goals within their school development plan. This has ensured a clear strategy, action plan and measurable impact on learning results within this excellent school.



Rising standards and the increased engagement of the wider community have been seen as a result of the school's ethos of celebrating all aspects of learning by working in partnership with the wider community. Becky Greenhalgh, Headteacher, commented, "The implementation of our Learning Platform, we feel, has been a three tier success. Children are fully engaged and excited with their learning which they can continue at home. Parents are able to access their child's learning and can support them at homes as well as being able to watch and listen to what their children do in school. All staff are now able to share resources and communicate with each other from anywhere school or home."
