Red Hill (C. of E.) Primary School, Worcestershire, has approximately 280 students from the ages of 3 – 11. [www.redhillprimary.org](http://www.redhillprimary.org)

In less than 1 academic year after Red Hill C.E. School selected the UniServity cLc (connected learning communities) Learning Platform, teaching and learning has been transformed. Learners have been key to a peer led cascade of skills throughout the school and worked hard to share their findings to other schools and the local authority."

Learners clearly have a voice at the school and this is shown by the number of collaborative activities that are now taking place within classes, year groups, and with local and international schools as far afield as Texas and Hefei, China. Learners have actively engaged with UniServity cLc Collaborative Projects, created online spaces about their school and developed wiki pages about Worcestershire for other schools to see.
